TORONTO PERFORMANCE TOUR

Day 1:

- Meet your Tour Director and board your private motor coach.
- Tour Casa Loma, a Gothic Revival mansion that serves as a historic museum. Now a local landmark, it took three years (and 300 men) to build the 200,000 square foot castle in the early 1900s. The house features intricate decorations, five acres of gardens, and a series of underground tunnels connecting the estate.
- Take advantage of the opportunity to perform for fellow visitors at Casa Loma.
- Head to the top of the CN Tower. The world's 9th tallest freestanding structure, standing over 1,800 feet tall, was named one of the Seven Wonders of the Modern World by the American Society of Civil Engineers. The Toronto skyline icon features glass elevators offering views of the city as you reach the Glass Floor, the Outdoor Observation Terrace, the Indoor Lookout Level, and the SkyPod.
- After dinner, enjoy a performance by the Toronto Symphony Orchestra at Roy Thomson Hall, or take in a show at the Princess of Wales Theatre.

Day 2:

- Travel to Niagara Falls, three waterfalls that line the border between Ontario in Canada and New York in the United States. Horseshoe Falls, American Falls, and Bridal Veil Falls range between 70 to 188 feet high and offer stunning views of the Niagara River as it heads toward Lake Ontario. During peak hours, more than six million cubic feet of water rumble over the crest of the falls each minute.
- · Enjoy lunch in Clifton Hill.
- Journey Behind the Falls as you descend 125 feet into 130-year-old tunnels. You'll hear the thunderous Horseshoe Falls well before you step out onto the observation deck at the foot of the falls. The experience offers a unique view as onefifth of the world's fresh water crashes down before your eyes.
- Perform for guests arriving to Medieval Times. Afterward, embark on an 11th-century adventure as you enjoy the dinner and tournament.

Day 3:

- Hone your skills at a performance clinic led by a professional artist. Workshops are available for dance, theatre, choir, band, or orchestra groups.
- Enter the curious and creative world of the **Ontario Science**Center. One of the world's first interactive science museums,
 OSC provides lifelong learners opportunities to learn
 about Canadian inventions and innovations, experience
 the intersection of art and science, experience live stage
 presentations, or conduct your own experiments!
- Perform for museum patrons at the Ontario Science Center.
- Enjoy a performance at the historic Ed Mirvish Theatre.

Day 4:

- Go into the wild at the Toronto Zoo! Interactive exhibits
 offer a unique wildlife experience that inspire visitors to
 champion and protect our wildlife habitats. Your visit takes
 you on a worldwide journey with southeast Asian tigers and
 orangutans, rainforest reptiles, African rhinos and giraffes,
 over 100 species of fish from the Great Barrier Reef, and more.
- Explore **Kensington Market** and **Chinatown**. Two of the most culturally diverse areas of Toronto, these colorful side-by-side neighborhoods are full of street-side vendors and vintage clothing shops.
